## **Section 13: Making Disciples:** *Teaching to Obey (Living in the Kingdom)*

Matthew 28:18 Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. 19 Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20 and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

**Note:** This passage of Scripture has been given the name "The Great Commission". It has this name because Jesus here is ordaining the church (all believers) to carry out a mission. This mission is the great mission of every follower of Jesus Christ. Every follower of Jesus Christ has the mission of making other disciples.

- 1) Below are two different phrases, one of which is the correct phrase that Jesus commands in the Great Commission. What is the difference between the ideas of these two phrases? Which one is easier to accomplish? Why?
  - "teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you"
  - "teaching them to know everything I have commanded you"

5)	What are the costs of Jesus' method that will prevent some from using it?
