

## John 13: 18 - 30

**John 13:18** "I am not referring to all of you; I know those I have chosen. But this is to fulfill the scripture: 'He who shares my bread has lifted up his heel against me.' **19** "I am telling you now before it happens, so that when it does happen you will believe that I am He. **20** I tell you the truth, whoever accepts anyone I send accepts me; and whoever accepts me accepts the one who sent me." **21** After he had said this, Jesus was troubled in spirit and testified, "I tell you the truth, one of you is going to betray me." **22** His disciples stared at one another, at a loss to know which of them he meant. **23** One of them, the disciple whom Jesus loved, was reclining next to him. **24** Simon Peter motioned to this disciple and said, "Ask him which one he means." **25** Leaning back against Jesus, he asked him, "Lord, who is it?" **26** Jesus answered, "It is the one to whom I will give this piece of bread when I have dipped it in the dish." Then, dipping the piece of bread, he gave it to Judas Iscariot, son of Simon. **27** As soon as Judas took the bread, Satan entered into him. "What you are about to do, do quickly," Jesus told him, **28** but no one at the meal understood why Jesus said this to him. **29** Since Judas had charge of the money, some thought Jesus was telling him to buy what was needed for the Feast, or to give something to the poor. **30** As soon as Judas had taken the bread, he went out. And it was night.

- 3) What was the fulfillment of Scripture referred to in verse 18?
- 4) Why did Jesus tell the disciples that one of them was going to betray Him?
- 5) According to verse 20, when a person rejects Jesus Christ who else do they also reject?

## John 13: 31 - 38

**John 13:31** When he was gone, Jesus said, "Now is the Son of Man glorified and God is glorified in him. **32** If God is glorified in him, God will glorify the Son in himself, and will glorify him at once. **33** "My children, I will be with you only a little longer. You will look for me, and just as I told the Jews, so I tell you now: Where I am going, you cannot come. **34** "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. **35** By this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another." **36** Simon Peter asked him, "Lord, where are you going?" Jesus replied, "Where I am going, you cannot follow now, but you will follow later." **37** Peter asked, "Lord, why can't I follow you now? I will lay down my life for you." **38** Then Jesus answered, "Will you really lay down your life for me? I tell you the truth, before the rooster crows, you will disown me three times!

- 4) What does Peter's question in verse 36 indicate about the disciple's understanding?
- 5) What did Jesus mean in the end of verse 36 when He said, "but you will follow later"?
- 6) In verse 37 and 38, what do we learn about our sinfulness and our attitude?
